dear Jim,

Anathus nob to tell you we missed the bus & had no share in the really brilliant victory that has cleared Germans out of Egypt - the mere Corps because - the only Reserve up - and on Wednesday thought we were certain to be used as for awhile Sidi Barrani held out steadily, but the bastards collapsed & so did our hopes. Jim Barrani, my wife is up with the 3rd Transport taking up nations helping to bring in prisoners, & that's all the share we are getting. It's the most bitter disappointment of my life and I'll say no more about it.

It really has been a brilliant victory, good planning, good well trained troops accustomed to the desert (though not a whit better or more seasoned than us) some "infantry" tanks which the Italian AT. weapons couldn't stop - and SURPRISE.

Roughly it went this way.

The Italians had the 1st & 2nd Libyan Divs, 1st Blackshirt Div, Maletta's Group - 5 bus plus odds ends - Libyan Armoured Group forward in a line of staggered camps. Echeloned back, right back to the frontier, were the 62nd & 63rd Metropolitan Divs & the 2nd Blackshirt (I think) plus more AFV formations. We had the

Indian Divn (4 Inf & 5 Bn. regular Bns) the remained
 Divn & a certain number of 1 Tanks with the
 4th N.Z. Bde in Reserve, ~~for battle~~ also a mobile
 force of under 2 Bns from the Matruh garrison.
 Counting in Bns only & excluding us as we
 didn't get in - 13 Bns (2 with the Armd D.) agst
 41 on their tanks & other arms in proportion.
 If they had kept the tanks & attacked, we'd
 have had more trouble.

Our splendid remained Divn,
 formidable Hussars in light tanks, R Tank Pkgs
 in Cuirass tanks had maintained practical
 command of all the ground outside the Italian
 camps & no surprise was possible. But
 it was necessary for the force to lie up all
 Sunday - a damned cold day - hiding within
 sheltering distances & tanks to perfect discipline
 & staff work & good air co-operation, this was
 done.

Then the attack came in as dawn
 agst the rear of Matelli's group on the left,
 while the Guard Divn seems to have driven
 past the rear of the 3 forward Divs direct
 for the road. Matelli was killed this force
 destroyed or captured & the infantry pushed
 north to Sidi Barrani which was taken by
 attack from the West and some sharp fighting
 the battalions attacked without arty. support
 & had heavy casualties. The enemy seem to
 have fought up to a point - but they caned

in when the infantry closed. In some cases they let the tanks through, bombing them at close quarters but burned it in when the infantry got up. Guns, foot, tanks & aircraft seem to have co-operated perfectly & the staff work & command must have been splendid. I've told you before that the Western Desert Army is a very fine one.

By mid afternoon the It. were surrendering freely and the supporting divisions made no effort to help, but bailed for Libya, harried by R.A.F. and the armoured division and the Navy. They apparently suffered dreadfully near Sollum, where they had to climb out of the coastal plain spartly as if passing from Samna over Scarborough Hill to Taylor's Mistake.



Today I hear that our armoured cavalry are near Bardia - the It. ~~are~~ ^{are} here in Libya & that the tally of prisoners is up to 37,000. I was in Matruh this morning & saw hundreds of prisoners being jammed to a destroyer for transport to Alex & the railway working to capacity on the same task. You all this can easuallies will certainly be under 1000, 600 they say, out of about 15000 men - at the most engaged.
