

he begged me to let

about two o'clock that

I have been to
the Zoological Gardens
and the Giza Pyramids
The zoological gardens
were first, containing
all sorts of animals
birds and snakes and
monkeys

From there we went to
the Giza Pyramids
arriving just before
sun-down instead of
climbing in the heat of the
day. We climbed the
biggest one, that of Cheops
it is quite an easy thing to
do if you take ordinary
care. But if anyone falls
they would probably roll
right to the bottom. Two
Australians have been
killed climbing the second
one that of Menephera
but this is smooth at the
top and is really difficult.
The big one is about
450 feet high and about
250 yards square at the
base. The stones are
anything up to 3 feet thick
generally about that
thickness so that it can not
be walked up but had to
be climbed
