Wednesday 23

Rode out to the Camp at the Washdyke. saw George Gibson ordered a ton of Kerosine sent Martin at the Washdyke with his swag. Sent the mare baby home to get shod. laid out the load up the Spar from the N. end of Tom Hill, fence for Page's new eas. Walked in to Tiverton at night found Mr. King & Mr. Shaw at Curious Store. Then it came on to blow & they had to stay all night with me. Paid Dr. Wilson for shooting 10/- paid the Shoemaker for mending the Children's shoes 14/- & for Gay's leggings 7/- Paid Beckingham for potatoes & chimney sweeping 7/- Cor 7/-

Thursday 24<sup>th</sup>

Plotted the road laid off yesterday, & worked out the quantities of fips thru sec. 9, Gay & Jack finishing 1/4 sec. 36 ac. & fips 4.2.24 afterwards went to the camp & laid out the boundaries of Page's other two sec. 50 & 45 ac. & rode home at night.

Friday 25.

went out again to Camp after computing the quantities of Page's 40 acre sec. came on wet. laid out his outside western boundary & did a good bit of chaining & rode home again by Foster's.

Saturday 26.<sup>th</sup>

Plotting all the secs. surveyed & going over the quantities again, found that I shall have to bring back Page's outer boundary 20 links. Worked out the quantities for another sec. that Page has bought 75 ac. Capt. Testimonial come down to Hastings

Sunday 27<sup>th</sup>

Mrs. Shaw came to church with Mrs. King & then remained at home. got a bad cold coming on. Signed Capt. Testimonial

Monday 28<sup>th</sup>

At the office, started Gay off to find the mare & bay off Page's last sec. did the necessary alterations & find me the old traverse marks to fix the upper Washdyke etc. fixing all the roads & sections on the proper map. Copied from the small map I have made. S. Smith came in. Paid for Capt. Testimonial 128 7 0

Tuesday -

29<sup>th</sup> Went with Geoffrey to the store for bag sugar boy tea etc. Called at the brick & tile works a bill on Shuttleworth for £50. Chisholm charged 17/- for it & 4/- for stamps - Paid Mr. Martin. Martin's wages to the end of December - Small rode to the Camp for me to get the men's signatures. & I took my report of work to C. S. Office at night for which I had to pay 1/6. Returned 1058 ac. & 8 miles of roads -

Wednesday 30.

At the office putting Page's secs &c upon the big map. Jack brought the cart in for potatoes. Gay digging them. Paid Mr. Guest for butter £40/-

Thursday 31<sup>st</sup>

Plotting Upper Washdyke Creek. on my new map. from L. Smith's field book transcribed five or six years ago -

Smith has lost Dutchman - Paid Mr. Shaw for Mrs. Gay's £3. to Smith 10/- for herself & Smith paid me on a/c £11.0.0

February -

Friday 1<sup>st</sup> Plotting Creek etc. upon the big map - with traverse lines to -

Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> Same as yesterday, finished plotting sections roads & traverses - made tracing of new work on Horabrook's new did a bit of Gun Planting. Smith out on my mare hunting Dutchman -

Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup>

Wet day. I have got a bad cold & was forced stay at home all day doing nothing. Smith returned with Dutchman from his camp -

Monday 4<sup>th</sup>

At the office working out quantities of secs. on Horabrook's new - all day. Poor Old Capt. says to day from Blythton for England. I never expect to see him again - Paid for a new shaft for cart - got Raymond the Shoemaker & fit one of my teeth in again. Paid him 2/-
