pyramid are the tombs of those who die in the building of the pyramids and to the south-east is the sphinx. To get to the pyramids you can go from Cairo at the rate of about thirty miles an hour in one of the breakneck motors or there is an electric tram which runs to within a quarter of a mile or a ghari. They all - motor, train, & ghari - stop at the foot of the plateau on which the pyramids stand. They are on a high reef which stands a hundred or two feet above the level of the flats between it and the Nile. You get out at the foot and can walk up a modern road, or take a donkey or camel.
