we were due to go to relieve another company of our Battalion. We got over here about

4:30. We had to climb a steep grassy bank hill at the top of the gully in which the Battalion was camp. Slip

and run down into a gully leading into Quinn's hill up this passing the spur called

Southern post on our right until we came to a spur running out from the top of

the valley called Quinn's Post. We are at present bivouaced in the left

gully and to go to Quinn's Post up here to go back to the first

of the gullies and up the one on the right. The side of the hill below the trenches is hardly more than a precipice. We get up to the trenches through a communication trench of so steep that steps have had to be cut for about 100 or 200 yds. The whole valley in fact almost down to the sea is an elaborate network of trenches.

Quinn's Post trenches are just on the near crest and the enemy are thing from 100 to 300 yds away. Grenades are going too and for all day. We are going up about eleven and were up there last night in reserve on the Golden Stars. A procession of dead bodies was going down one, a turn,
