Boat drill at 6.15 A.M.

Blowing a gale from South.
Too windy for ship to leave
sailing postponed for 24 hours.
broad of people on wharf.

Showery in morning, cleared off
in afternoon. Great crowd of
people on wharf.

At next wharf is Dutch liner
"New Amsterdam," also in port
is the Finnish barque "Pamir"
- a four master.

M.B. Not "New Amsterdam" - but
"Johan Mam Oldenbarnevelt"
- 2 funnels - about 20,000 tons.

Wrote to Edna. Had shave.

To bed 10 p.m.

Monday 15th. Sept.

Calm morning. Left Wellington
at 10 A.M.: huge crowd on
wharf. Dutch liner drew
out at 9.45 A.M. H.M.S. Achilles
followed us.

At 2 p.m. paraded on B.
deck + received pair of
sandals each.

Three vessels of convoy in
line ahead, Achilles,
Aquitania + Dutch liner.

After tea saw last of
No. 3. fade from view. Left
6.15 p.m. two aircraft from
land flew over ship. Went
to movies with Bob Holmes
shaved, put clock back 1
hour + went to bed 9 p.m.
