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beautifully clear & cool. As with
the other Holy Places in Pales-
-tine, there is a church above
the site of the carpenter's shop.
We went on from here by bus
to Tiberias, passing en route
the village of Cana where Christ
performed the first of his
miracles - turning the water into
wine at the wedding feast.

Tiberias possesses many modern
stone buildings & is rather a pretty
place, on the slopes overlooking
the lake. The Sea of Galilee
looked beautifully blue,
nestling among the brown hills.
We had time for a swim
& a row in a boat. Then
we returned, through Nazareth
& this time round the back
of Mt. Tabor, joining our
original road farther on. We
went back in camp in time
for dinner.

On another day Alan &
I went to Tel Aviv, an
hour's run by bus from camp.
